STUDY & TRIAL UPDATES

CABARET Study: A randomised phase II study of Carboplatin and Bevacizumab in Recur-rent Glioblastoma Multiforme (GBM)

The CABARET Study continues to progress in leaps and bounds with recruitment to part 1 of the study now closed after reaching our recruitment target. Our final patient was randomised on the 15 March 2012, almost 8 months ahead of schedule.

Monash Medical Centre finished on top of the recruitment ladder with Royal Melbourne Hospital a close second and Royal Prince Alfred and St Vincent's (Melbourne) Hospitals not far behind. 122 patients were recruited to Part 1 of the study, with 23 patients continuing on to Part 2 so far. The emphasis now will be on increasing the number of patients continuing on to Part 2 of the study.

The collection of tumour and plasma samples for the CABARET translational substudy continues. We would like to take this opportunity to remind site staff to ensure all patients are given the opportunity to participate in the substudy. The more samples we can collect, the more likely we are to have a meaningful outcome.

As always, a huge thank you to all the site staff involved with making the study run so successfully. Our fantastic recruitment numbers are a reflection of your continued efforts and commitment.

STUDY & TRIAL UPDATES

CATNON (EORTC 26053-22054): Phase III trial on concurrent and adjuvant Temozolomide chemotherapy in non-1p/19q deleted anaplastic glioma.

The holiday period has been quieter than usual for the CATNON Trial (the same trend was observed in the previous year). We hope that this is not an indication of the year ahead! The CATNON trial has now registered 62 patients and randomised 32 patients in total from 10 active sites.

Congratulations to Dr Katharine Cuff and her research team at the Princess Alexandra Hospital for being the first Queensland site to be activated to the CATNON Trial. The site is in the process of registering their first patient and hopefully more patients to follow. To date we have activated 10 sites and work is underway to activating 1 more site in the next few weeks. We will be looking into activating Westmead Hospital to add to the recruiting sites in NSW.

Recent processes have also been circulated to all sites regarding requirements for tumour sample shipments to the EORTC in the Netherlands. So far, the processes have proven effective in ensuring that the correct requirements and timing for shipment are met.

The Site Coordinators continue to do a fantastic job in keeping on top of submitting the case report forms and queries. Additionally, other activities include the processing of the next batch of the Quality Assurance Radiotherapy requests from the EORTC.

SEED Study: Self-reported evaluation of the adverse effects of dexamethasone

The SEED study is slowly but steadily progressing in terms of recruitment. Sacred Heart is currently leading the recruitment with 10 patients registered with Braeside closely behind with 8 patients. The study will remain open to recruitment until at least the end of 2012. The target population is 50 patients and their caregivers, of which 25 patients are required to have a primary brain tumour and the remaining 25 patients can comprise of either brain metastases or advanced cancer. Currently only 5/18 patients recruited to the study have a primary brain tumour. Emphasis will be on recruiting more patients with primary brain tumours.
