CATNON study update

CATNON (EORTC 26053-22054): Phase III trial on concurrent and adjuvant Temozolomide chemotherapy in non-1p/19q deleted anaplastic glioma.

Following Central Ethics Approval of the current EORTC protocol version 2.2 and the Group Specific Appendix version 1.0, site ethics application packages to assist each CATNON participating sites have now been sent. Activities to get each site up and running are well underway with the first few sites expected to gain approval before the end of November. The members of the Trial Management Committee which consist of Associate Professor Anna Nowak (Australian CATNON Study Chair) and clinicians of various disciplines from each state has been finalised with the first meeting to be held prior to activation of the first site. This committee with support from the CATNON coordinating centre will provide oversight for the Australian conduct, monitoring, recruitment, local logistical and operational issues of the study.

The NHMRC Clinical Trials Centre is in regular communication with the EORTC, the lead international collaborative group and Schering Plough, the drug suppliers of the study. An extremely exciting and busy time for the trial!
