COGNO is pleased to announce that the 2011 COGNO Annual Scientific Meeting (ASM) will be held in conjunction with the Macquarie Neurosurgical Research and Clinical Symposium at Macquarie University, Sydney.

The Macquarie Symposium will be held on 5 & 6 August - their morning session on 6 August has been designed with a particular focus on brain tumours, ranging from translational science, clinical management updates and emerging technology.

The COGNO ASM follows immediately after, from lunchtime on 6 August through to lunchtime 7 August. The COGNO ASM sessions include management of glioblastoma in the elderly, a forum to meet and hear from key translational scientists undertaking glioma research, updates on the status of current and emerging clinical translational research being conducted nationally, and the challenges of clinical endpoints selection in neuro-oncology trials. A preliminary program appears on the next page.

Eminent clinician and neuro-oncology researcher, Dr Annika Malmstrom, from University Hospital Linköping, Sweden, has been confirmed as an international speaker; with an international neurosurgical speaker to be announced in the near future.

SEED: Self-reported evaluation of the adverse effects of Dexamethasone

COGNO has now finalised site selection and anticipate on recruiting from 5 sites across NSW. COGNO is busy working with sites on start-up activities with the first site ready to recruit patients in May 2011. The recruitment target over 12 months is 100 participants in total (comprising 50 patients and their 50 associated caregivers). The members of the Study Management Committee consist of A/Prof Meera Agar (study chair), clinicians and members from the NHMRC CTC coordinating centre. This committee will provide oversight for the conduct, recruitment, data collection, management and statistical analysis for the study.

**CATNON (EORTC 26053-22054):** Phase III trial on concurrent and adjuvant Temozolomide chemotherapy in non-1p/19q deleted anaplastic glioma.

We are glad to bring great news regarding the recruitment rate for the CATNON trial. Recruitment activities have been more than satisfactory in Australia since the trial opened in August 2010. The CATNON trial has now registered **28** patients and randomised **13** patients in total from **7** active sites, with the rate of recruitment expected to increase as more sites are activated.

By now, all active sites are well aware that the process from identification to administration of trial treatment in this study requires careful attention as it involves a number of steps including the shipment and testing of tumours to the EORTC in the Netherlands, and keeping within the timelines needing to be met. We would like to acknowledge and thank all the trial team members at each active site for their efforts and hard work in making the process as smooth as possible.

A special mention to A/Prof Michael Back and Dr Helen Wheeler and team at the Royal North Shore Hospital (NSW) for leading the current figures for both registration and randomisation.

We continue to collaborate closely with other sites in Australia with their local ethics and research governance submissions, and other logistical requirements prior to activation and we hope to activate most of the sites by mid-2011.

**CABARET Study:** A randomised phase II study of Carboplatin and Bevacizumab in Recurrent Glioblastoma Multiforme (GBM)

The CABARET study has made significant progress since the last issue of the COGNO Newsletter, with the first site activated and the first patient recruited to the study. In November Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney was activated as a pilot site for the study. Five patients have now been randomised and commenced study treatment at that site.

Ethics and governance submissions are currently underway at sites across the country, with the aim of activating many of these sites early in 2011. Currently we have five sites activated across the country.

The Investigator Meeting for the CABARET study was held on the 9 December at the Stamford Plaza Hotel, Sydney Airport. The CABARET team were very pleased with the large turn-out and success of the event and would like to thank all of those who attended.
