There has also been a lot of work going on in the background to develop data collection tools and processes, along with other processes to management the successful running of the studies.

CABARET Study: A randomised phase II study of Carboplatin and Bevacizumab in Recurrent Glioblastoma Multiforme (GBM)

Since opening the first site in November 2010 the CABARET study has made significant progress opening 14 sites in 10 months. Site activations will continue over the coming months with at least 3 more sites expected to open by the end of the year.

Forty-three patients have been randomised to Part 1 of the study, with Royal Melbourne Hospital being our top recruiter with 9 patients. Congratulations to Dr Kathryn Field and her team at RMH. Three patients have continued on to Part 2 of the study, with more expected to follow as patients complete study treatment in Part 1. For more detailed recruitment figures please refer to the table on the right.

We would also like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to all the trial team members at each site for their continued dedication and hard work. With over one-third of the total patients already recruited we are very grateful for your efforts to ensure the study runs as smoothly as possible.

The addition of a translational research substudy to the CABARET protocol is currently underway and will involve collaboration with local Australian laboratories as well as International laboratories. Stay tuned for further updates regarding this substudy.

CATNON (EORTC 26053-22054): Phase III trial on concurrent and adjuvant Temozolomide chemotherapy in non-1p/19q deleted anaplastic glioma

Recruitment activities have been consistent in the last few months. The CATNON trial has now registered 43 patients and randomised 22 patients in total from 9 active sites, with the rate of recruitment expected to increase as more sites are activated.

Two more sites are working through all the requirements for activation to recruit. The first South Australian site was activated in late July. Flinders Medical Centre has now registered and randomised their first patient to the study. Furthermore, another Victorian site was activated in late August. Congratulations to the team from Flinders Medical Centre and the Alfred Hospital for their hard work in meeting all the requirements for activation.

The Royal North Shore Hospital continues to lead the recruitment tally with 20 patients registered for tissue genetic testing and 12 patients randomised to receive treatment in the study.

We have also recently rolled out a standard process across all sites to ensure that the timeline from the results of patient eligibility to approval for randomisation of patients is as minimal as possible. This process is working well and we thank sites for their support in the process implementation.

Overall, active Australian sites are in close communication with the CATNON Coordinating Centre to submit all trial requirements, and data, and to send any enquiries they have.
